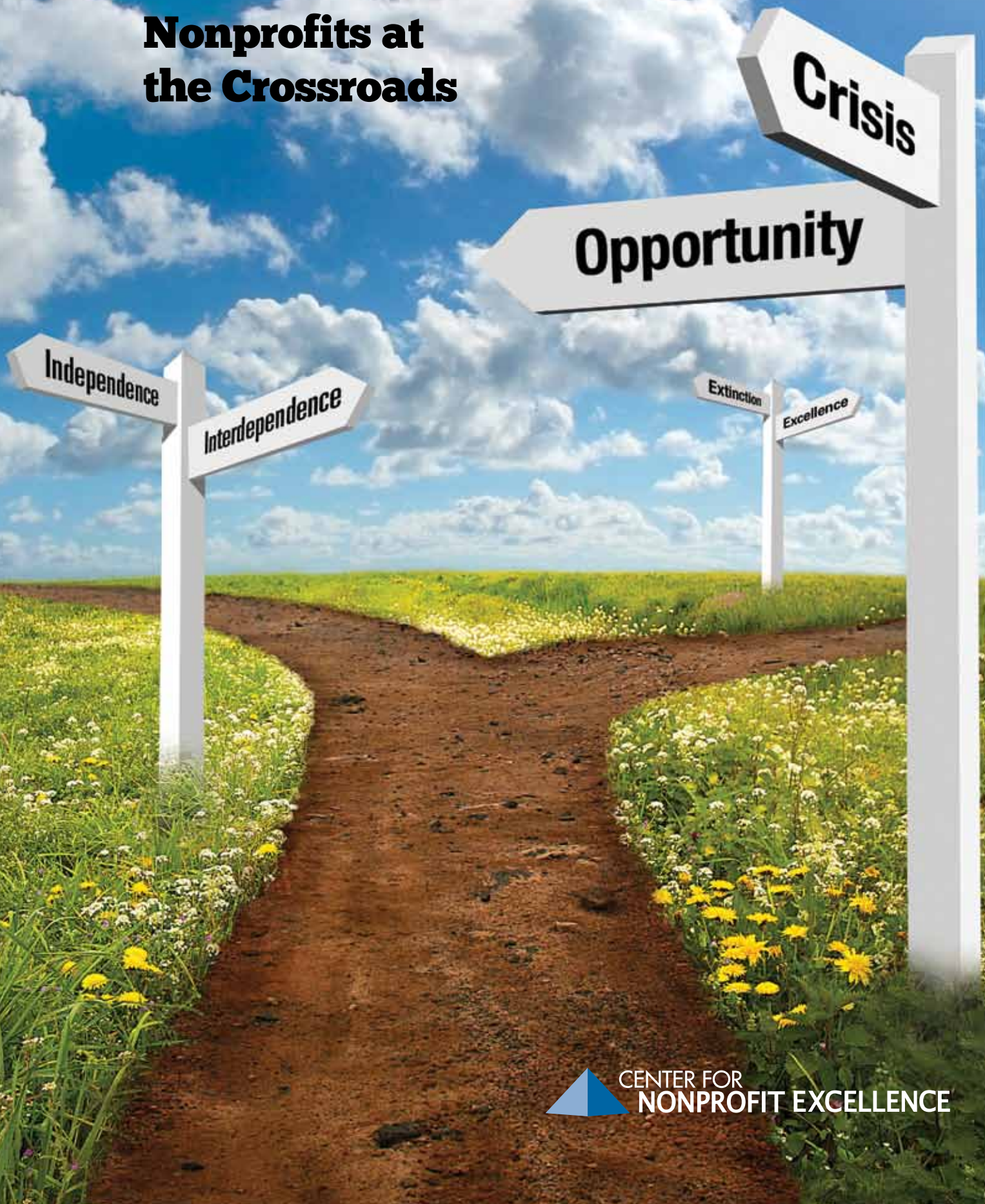

Throughout 2010, CNPE:

- Hosted a Summit on Information Technology followed by an Innovation Lab for IT Application in partnership with the University of Louisville
- Offered the Leadership Network program under the mantle of CNPE
- Added new adjunct consultants in marketing, graphic design and organizational development
- Supported the formation of the Innovation Exchange community
- Offered access to a new association health insurance plan

Each passing year becomes harder to recap. It seems to us that the speed of change, the sense of fragility about our institutions and the certainty of uncertainty call into question nearly all of our current assumptions.

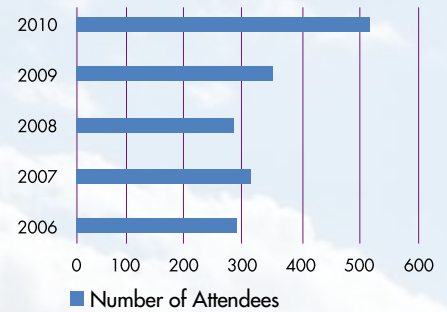


Annual Conference 2010 - Vision 2020: Inspire a Community Where Everyone Thrives

Professional Development & Shared Learning



Leadership Network

A peer-learning forum for established nonprofit leaders

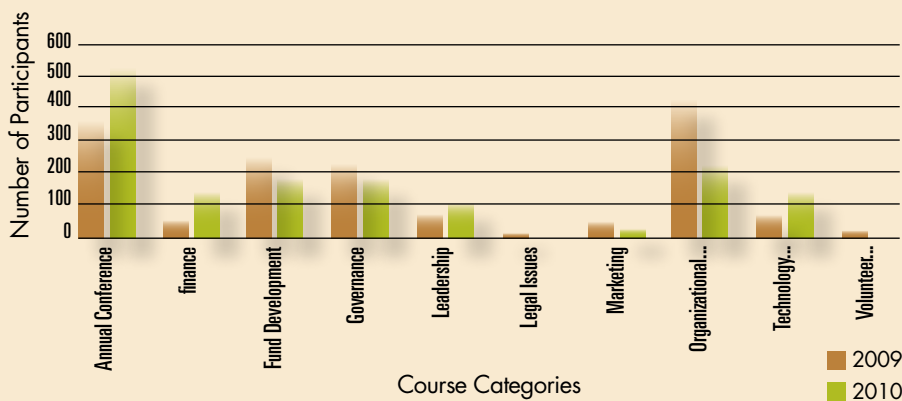
CNPE's emphasis on learning, shared knowledge and collaborative discovery is a cornerstone of its mission. Nowhere is that emphasis more concentrated than the experience of the flagship programs: Get on Board; Leadership Network; Board Chair Boot Camp and the Emerging Executives Institute.

The flagship offerings are nestled among a broad array of seminars, covering the full range of topics required for organizational success. In 2010, 1,323 attended 71 sessions rating them, on average, at 4.6 on a 5-point scale.

Some of the more significant trends included a 30 percent increase at the annual conference luncheon celebration, a five-fold increase in financial management seminar attendance and a three-fold increase in technology collaboration and training.

Organizational-related seminar attendance declined in 2010, owing principally to a reduced number of individuals attending the Nonprofit Start-Up Clinic (142 attended in 2009 compared with 100 in 2010).

The surge in technology-related activity was driven by the partnership with the University of Louisville and its innovative outreach project to assist nonprofit organizations with information management systems. Support from the Brown-Forman Corporation and the UPS Foundation made possible the technology improvements among 55 nonprofits over the past two years.

Additionally, 71 nonprofit leaders participated in a forum that compared Louisville area organizational IT trends with national data with respect to levels of strategic IT planning, integration and effectiveness. Louisville area groups lagged their counterparts nationally based on IT survey results, revealing a sizeable deficit in the level of IT strategic planning locally.

Leadership Network graduated its 11th class in July 2010, the first such class that sailed under the CNPE mantle. Ten senior executives from the nonprofit sector participated in an intensive six-month leadership journey that expanded their capacity to lead.

In a confidential setting, leaders shared their challenges, learned techniques to form imaginative alternatives, co-created solutions, and built confidence toward successful leadership growth. The result was a powerfully shared learning experience.

Consultation Highlight - CNPE Launches New Book



For over ten years, the Center for Nonprofit Excellence has been supporting and showcasing narratives in the regional nonprofit sector that speak to moments of extraordinary achievement that help illuminate the path toward excellence.

In preparation for its 10th Annual Conference which was held in the fall of 2010, CNPE made the decision during the summer to catalogue these achievements in a more permanent form by publishing a book on all of the winners of CNPE's Art of Excellence awards.

Since its inception, CNPE has recognized excellence in the key categories related to organizational success: Vision, Leadership, Governance, Diversity and Collaboration at its annual conference.

The resulting book, entitled *Striving for Excellence in the Social Sector: A Decade of Distinction* written by CNPE's Director of Consultation Eric Schmall, describes the importance of each of these categories and why they continue to be of strategic importance. It also recounts the story of each of the 50 winning groups and the circumstances of their achievement to offer examples of how excellence manifests itself throughout this sector in our region. CNPE Salutes AmeriCorps VISTA



Help Build Capacity with Nonprofits Serving High Poverty Areas

This year also brought the valuable addition of two AmeriCorp VISTA groups to the CNPE team. Working under the supervision of Desiree P. Jones, these two full-time volunteers extended capacity-building services to nonprofits working with the region's most financially impoverished populations.

Organizations benefitted significantly from their technical support and assistance which were delivered via interviews, member visits, research projects, newsletters featuring stories and interviews, and video clips clarifying pivotal nonprofit issues. While the two VISTA volunteers worked together, they had specialized roles to assist nonprofits in targeted ways.



Amanda Rogerson, who holds a masters degree in Global Politics and Intercultural Studies from the University of Wales, spearheaded special research projects, fulfilling over 100 member requests for information. She created a significant body of now easily accessible information by developing an organized system of Frequently

Asked Questions, which will benefit nonprofits well beyond the duration of her VISTA work time in Louisville.



Her VISTA cohort, Samantha Kimmey, is a recent graduate from Kenyon College who earned a degree in English. Samantha focused on supporting professional and skill development of staff and volunteers with designated organizations. In addition to working directly with members of those agency-staff teams, she coordinated follow-up contacts with training participants and worked closely with Merv Antonio, CNPE's Director of Learning. Together they published the monthly e-newsletter, Louisville Linked.

CNPE 2010 Capital Campaigns Study

With the support of the Paul Ogle Foundation, CNPE completed a study of Louisville area nonprofits that are planning, conducting or completing a capital campaign. Before completing the 2010 capital campaign study, CNPE had surveyed the Louisville area from 2001 through 2003.

Here are the highlights of the 2010 capital campaign report:

- There were 33 ongoing campaigns that had combined goals of \$817.4 million, of which \$626.8 million (77 percent) had been raised.
- 11 organizations reported new campaigns with combined goals of \$82.8 million. Eleven percent of that combined total had been raised.
- 15 organizations are planning campaigns with many of them in the silent phase. Of the combined \$43.8 million represented by those campaigns, 8 percent had been committed.
- 4 organizations reported a combined total \$111.7 million from their recently (past 12 months) completed campaigns, which represented 89 percent of the combined goals.

Membership

Sporadic, if not continuous, turbulence has characterized the past two years for organizations of most every stripe. As predicted by Paul Light and other experts in the field of civic sector dynamics and trends, organizations with a high degree of civic engagement, a strong brand and visionary leadership have fared considerably better than others.

Despite the hardships faced by nonprofit organizations, 85 percent of CNPE members stayed with their family of cohorts through the CNPE network, supporting the proposition that collaboration and shared learning are even more important during times of heightened economic challenges.

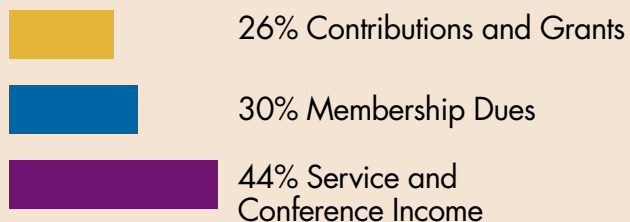

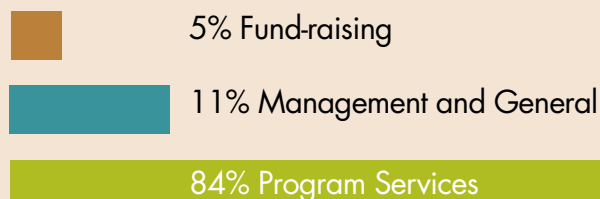
